In 1977 he earned his Certificate in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and in 1978 a fellowship Certificate in Tumor and Reconstructive Surgery both from the University of Miami School of Medicine where he retired from In 2021 as Professor of Surgery and Chief of Surgery at Jackson South Hospital.

Dr. Marx is currently the Chief Science Consultant for the stem division of Lenkbar Co. Dr. is a noted pioneer in the concepts and treatments of numerous pathologies, hyperbaric oxygen, platelet rich plasma, smoking carcinogenesis, recombinant human bone morphogenetic protein, and in-situ tissue engineering.

Dr. Marx was the first to publish on osteonecrosis of the jaws due to bisphosphonates and has since published three text books on what is now called Drug Induced Osteonecrosis of the Jaws to go along with his 11 other textbooks. The textbook *Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology: A Rational for Diagnosis and Treatment* won the Medical Writers Book of the Year award.

Dr. Marx professional awards include the W. Harry Archer Award, the William J. Gies Award for life long contributions to Dentistry, the Paul Bert Award in Hyperbaric Medicine, the Donald B. Osbon Educator Award and the AAOMS Research Recognition Award twice.

G. E. Ghali, DDS, MD, FACS, FRCS(Ed)



Dr. Ghali has lived and practiced in Shreveport, Louisiana since 1993. He and his wife, Hope, have four children. Dr. Ghali's practice spans the full scope of craniomaxillofacial surgery. His professional interest lies in the treatment of pediatric craniofacial deformities including craniosynostosis, cleft lip and palate, and dentofacial deformities. Dr. Ghali has continued to serve in leadership positions in national and international organizations such as the ACS, AAOMS, ABOMS, and IAOMS. Dr. Ghali's association with these organizations is recognized in shaping the profession of oral and maxillofacial surgery, as well as providing international recognition for this community.

Dr. Ghali has numerous research interests including clinical and basic science research. He has published in numerous peer-reviewed journals, written many book chapters and has edited textbooks that are vital to the knowledge base of many in the specialty.

AWARD WINNERS

Lifetime Achievement Award: Eric T. Geist, DDS



Dr. Eric Geist is a native of Louisiana. He completed his undergraduate dental training at LSU Medical Center in New Orleans, he then completed the advanced educational program in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at LSU Medical Center in New Orleans and associated hospitals. He served on the Board of Directors and as President of both the Louisiana State Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons and the Southeastern Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons.

Dr. Geist served for six years as a Board Examiner for the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. Afterward, he was elected to serve on the Board of Directors for the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons where he served for six years and ultimately as President of the Board.

He is a Fellow of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons and served on the Board of Trustees of the organization for three years and was elected Vice-President. He subsequently went on to serve as President of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. He served on the Board of Directors of the OMS Foundation including two years as Vice Chairman. He is a fellow of the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology and is a Fellow of the American College of Dentist and Clinical Assistant Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at LSU Health Science Center, Shreveport. He also served as Clinical Associate Professor and Course Director of Head and Neck Anatomy and General and Oral Pathology at the University of Louisiana at Monroe.

He received the LSU Dental School Outstanding Alumnus Award, the LSU New Orleans OMS Outstanding Alumnus Award, the Nicholls State University Outstanding Alumnus Award and the Distinguished Service Award from both the Northeast Louisiana Dental Association and the Louisiana Dental Association.

AWARD WINNERS

Distinguished Service Award: W. Mark Tucker, DDS



W. Mark Tucker, DDS Mark Tucker, DDS, a native of Shelbyville and Clinton, Tennessee, knew at an early age the profession he wanted to pursue. In pursuit of his dream, Tucker received his bachelor's degree in chemistry from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville in 1963. Following in his uncle's footsteps, he attended UTHSC COD and obtained his Doctor of Dental Surgery in December 1966. Tucker went on to complete his oral and maxillofacial surgery residency at the University of Texas Dental Branch at Houston and the Houston Veterans' Affairs Medical Center. He also fulfilled a maxillofacial surgery fellowship in North Wales, UK.

Tucker began his practice as a general dentist at the Hampton VA Medical Center in Virginia in 1968. He was named chief of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Section at James A. Haley Veterans' Hospital in Tampa, Florida in June 1972, and he remained in the post until December 2009. For more than 30 years, Tucker served as a consultant for six private and three federal hospitals throughout Florida. He was a member of the charter faculty of the University of South Florida College of Medicine, and he served for many years as Hillsborough County Associate Medical Examiner for forensic odontology. He founded the Hillsborough County Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeons Group, has made more than 240 scientific presentations, written or contributed to more than 30 scientific journal articles, and participated in clinical research.

Tucker's proudest professional achievement is serving as past president of the American Association of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeons. He also held leadership positions in the Florida Society of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeons and the Hillsborough County Dental Research Clinic. Tucker holds invited fellowships in the American College of Dentists and in the International College of Dentists, and he is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and the National Dental Board of Anesthesiology. Since his retirement from James A. Haley Veterans' Hospital, Tucker has served as the oral & maxillofacial surgeon at MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa and practiced privately at the Florida Craniofacial Institute where he is still affiliated as Surgeon Emeritus.

Frank DiPlacido Humanitarian Service Award: N. Ray Lee, DDS



Dr. Lee is an expert in oral and maxillofacial surgery who began a career in the healthcare field more than 40 years ago when he served as a combat medic and dental specialist in the United States Air Force. He later earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology at the College of William and Mary. He graduated with a DDS degree from Baylor College of Dentistry and then completed his residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Virginia Commonwealth University.

Board certified by the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Dr. Lee has proved himself to be a knowledgeable, experienced and dedicated surgeon. In addition to his board certification, Dr. Lee also proudly serves as a member of the American Dental Association, the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, the Virginia Dental Association, the Peninsula Dental Society, and was even a former president of the Virginia Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons.

Passionate about changing people's lives through his work, Dr. Lee loves what he does and continues to develop his skills to better serve his patients. He truly cares about each of his patients as individuals, taking time to determine their personal needs, concerns and fears and addressing them individually. He thanks God for the blessings he's had to be in a position where he can help change the lives of his patients.

Dr. Lee started the 501C3 charity, Operation Restore Oral Health, and now serves as the chairman of the board. He is the designer and developer of the Genial Bone Advancement Trephine Surgical Procedure and the medical instruments used for the surgery in conjunction with the Stryker Liebhinger Corporation. Dr. Lee also designed and developed the OSA Plating System in cooperation with the Osteomed Corporation.
