SPEAKERS

Tara Aghaloo, DDS, MD, PhD



Dr. Tara Aghaloo is Professor in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at UCLA. She completed her DDS at UMKC, and OMFS residency, MD, and PhD at UCLA. She is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, and her clinical practice focuses on bone and soft tissue regeneration, and dental implant surgery. She is a board member of the OsteoScience Foundation, Past President of the AO, and Associate Editor of the JOMS.

Session Description: Surgeons face increasingly complex patients, requiring predictable outcomes despite challenges like chronic diseases, aging, and poor systemic health. Oral and maxillofacial surgeons must address patients' diverse medical conditions, medications, and lifestyle factors to optimize recovery

and ensure surgical success. Achieving favorable outcomes involves preoperative patient optimization, advanced diagnostics, and regenerative strategies tailored to compromised or osteoporotic patients. Similarly, dental implant success depends on proper case selection, meticulous planning, and effective management of complications, particularly with the rise in demand for advanced and immediate-placement techniques. This presentation will explore strategies and innovations for optimizing patient health and achieving ideal surgical and implant outcomes.

Rui Fernandes, DMD, MD, FACS, FRCS



Dr. Rui Fernandes is a professor of oral and maxillofacial surgery at the University of Florida and a board-certified surgeon at UF Health Jacksonville. He serves as associate chair of the UF Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, chief of the Division of Head and Neck Surgery, and program director of the Head and Neck Oncologic Surgery and Microvascular Fellowship. He also directs the UF Center for Reconstructive Surgery and co-directs the UF Health Skull Base Surgery Program. Specializing in head and neck cancer, oral cancer, salivary gland pathology, jaw tumors, and microvascular reconstruction, Dr. Fernandes is a leader in his field. He earned his dental degree from Boston University, medical degree from the University of Alabama, and completed advanced training at the University of Maryland.

Session Description: The reconstruction and rehabilitation of jaws following ablative surgery have been transformed in recent years by the development of computer-assisted surgery and virtual surgical planning. This presentation aims to discuss the current state-of-the-art jaw reconstruction, and to preview the potential future developments. Currently, a great deal of research has been conducted on augmented/mixed reality, artificial intelligence, virtual surgical planning for hard and soft tissue reconstruction, and the rehabilitation of the stomatognathic system. This will lead to an even more exciting future for the functional reconstruction and rehabilitation of the jaw following ablative surgery. These concepts will be addressed for both the mandible and maxilla.

Teresa Biggerstaff, DDS, MD



Dr. Teresa Biggerstaff, a native of Washington State, began her training at the University of California, San Francisco School of Dentistry. She completed her Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery training and medical school at LSU, which gave her the opportunity to evaluate and treat the entire spectrum of oral and maxillofacial problems. Following her residency, she moved to North Carolina for a fellowship in Facial Cosmetic Surgery and has been in private practice there ever since. She enjoys private practice and also enjoys hosting and teaching residents in the Osteoscience Observership program. She maintains a very busy oral surgery and facial surgery practice in two locations and owns and directs a medical spa as well. Dr. Biggerstaff serves on the executive committee of the NC Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons and serves on multiple committees for the SSOMS.

Session Description: Bone and soft tissue grafting have advanced significantly due to innovations in biomaterials, enabling successful dental rehabilitation with implants. Predictable outcomes depend on patient selection, surgical technique, biomaterial choice, and sound design, but failures can still occur. Emerging evidence links micronutrient deficiencies to failures in bone grafting, soft tissue healing, and implant osseointegration. With modern diets often lacking essential nutrients, particularly in older patients who frequently seek dental implants, addressing these deficiencies is crucial. This presentation will explore the role of micronutrients in regenerative procedures and strategies to optimize their levels for better outcomes.



Lifetime Achievement Award: Peter D. Waite, DDS, MD, MPH



Dr. Peter D. Waite is Professor Emeritus and former McCallum Chair of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Alabama. He served as Program Director for seven years and Department Chair for nearly 30 years. Dr. Waite earned his DDS from the University of Minnesota and his MD from the University of Alabama. His clinical expertise includes impacted teeth, orthognathic surgery, craniofacial reconstruction, cleft lip/palate, cosmetic surgery, obstructive sleep apnea, and dental implants. Dr. Waite is an internationally recognized lecturer, past president of the AACS, and editor of *Peterson's Principles of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery*. He has received numerous awards, including the OKU Fred Heney Award, the Don Osborn Outstanding Educator Award, and the AAOMS Clinical Research Award. His contributions to the field include groundbreaking publications on rhinoplasty in orthognathic surgery, sleep apnea surgery,

and enhanced recovery protocols in orthognathic reconstruction. He has authored over 100 peer-reviewed articles, edited eight books, and written 37 book chapters, delivering more than 260 lectures worldwide. Dr. Waite continues to mentor residents at UAB and spends summers as a volunteer forest ranger at Grand Teton National Park, working with the Wildlife Bear Brigade. He considers his greatest achievements to be his wife, three children, and six grandchildren.

Distinguished Educators Award: Anthony Morlandt, DDS, MD, FACS



Dr. Morlandt, a Floresville, Texas native, graduated from Baylor University and earned his DDS magna cum laude from the University of Texas Health Sciences Center in San Antonio. He completed his MD, internship, and residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Alabama School of Medicine, followed by a fellowship in head and neck oncology and microsurgery at the University of Florida. Currently, Dr. Morlandt is the Chief of Oral Oncology at UAB Medicine and a full-time academic head and neck surgeon. He also directs UAB's Head and Neck Oncology Fellowship program and is an Associate Scientist with the UAB Comprehensive Cancer Center. Dr. Morlandt has received the AAOMS Faculty Educator Development Award and is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and a

member of the American Head and Neck Society. Specializing in oral oncology and head and neck microvascular surgery, he has authored numerous scientific articles and textbook chapters. His focus is on identifying head and neck cancers and improving outcomes after major surgeries.
